

Eagle Service Project helpful information

Eagle Scout Service Project

1. One of the requirements to advance from Life Scout to Eagle Scout is completing an Eagle Scout Leadership Service Project. Consult the [Eagle Project Workbook](#) and **read** the information provided in this workbook before you complete the first section: The Proposal.
2. The project Proposal needs to be approved by the Scoutmaster, Committee Chair and Project Beneficiary before you can obtain approval from the District Advancement Committee. Please do not start with the actual project (Part B & C), fundraising or purchasing materials before you obtain all 4 signatures.
3. It is recommended to process the Eagle Scout Service Project Fundraising Application (included in the workbook) at the same time. This document needs to be signed by the Project Beneficiary or representative, Scoutmaster and District advancement Committee (for Council approval). This document needs to be signed before a scout can hold fundraiser to raise funds and buy the needed supplies to complete the project.

Your District Committee will provide additional guidance regarding the project, workbook completion and the Life to Eagle Process when they review and approve your project proposal
